



Ed Park is the author of the novels *Personal Days* and *Same Bed Different Dreams*. He is an American journalist and novelist, and a founding editor of *The Believer*, and has worked in newspapers, book publishing, and academia. His writing appears in *The New Yorker*, *The New York Review of Books*, *Harper's Magazine*, *The Atlantic*, and elsewhere.

In May 2008, his debut novel *Personal Days* was published by Random House. It was a finalist for that year's Hemingway Foundation/PEN Award, the Center for Fiction First Novel Prize (then known as the John Sargent Sr. First Novel Prize), and the Asian American Literary Award. It was also named one of the ten best fiction books of the year by *Time*.^[1]
